Maintenance update

Preim has received reports from residents regarding the lack of maintenance on certain parts of the TGV Development. An update was issued via the TGV App and Website confirming that the developers will be instructing their landscapers to start works towards the end of May 21. For further information on this issue please refer to the TGV Community website.

In terms of works across the handed over TGVCIC areas residents should note the following:

- The wild grass basins at the top of The Stray will have their first cut of the season towards the end of June/early July.
- David Wilson Homes will be undertaking remedial works to the parts of The Stray that border their phase.
- Residents will have noted that during May the
 weather was very wet, this led to some weeks
 where certain parts of the CIC areas were not
 cut. Due to how the TGV Soil can retain water
 for long periods of time it has been agreed with
 the TGVCIC landscapers that they will not cut
 the grass when it is too wet or if the land is still
 sodden following long periods of rainfall.
- The annual tree survey will be completed in August 2021.
- The Play Area Survey was completed in May 2021 and any works will be completed in June or July.
 Once the works have been agreed information will go out via the app and website.
- Basins will be cleared in early September, as will any ditch clearance work and hedges that require cutting

Any major works will have additional information issued via the website and app and as always should residents have any concerns or queries regarding any areas handed over to the TGVCIC then please contact the **Preim Ltd Helpdesk**.

Greenhouse Project allows our community spirit to blossom

Our superstar residents Stu Olden and Pete Welsh are well known as the green fingered duo behind TGV In Bloom – which won a coveted Silver medal in last year's Britain in Bloom campaign.

As part of this, they launched the TGV In Bloom Club - which meets once a month to carry out work on the community allotment, build street planters, litter picking and engaging with residents through the RHS Three Pillars; horticulture, environment and community.



As a result, additional planters have been placed around the village for use by green-fingered residents; also offering fresh cut flowers and home-grown vegetables.

But with the temporary greenhouses often taking a battering due to the British weather, the team successfully applied for a £5,000 National Lottery grant to pay for the new greenhouse, which stands on a vacant and unusable allotment plot near to the community plot.

Volunteers have been working on the 'Greenhouse Project' for the last six months; digging out the foundations, filling with cement to form a solid concrete base and building a path around the outsides. The area is finished with raised beds, a stone/gravel path and a seating area for volunteers to enjoy.

All this work has been conducted by our fantastic TGV In Bloom volunteers. The group has received

many kind donations of building materials and heavy discounts on plant hire to allow them to work together to complete this community project.

They already have several more projects lined up, including installing a brand new 'Thankful Village' Memorial, Children's gardening club, herb planters outside our village shop, open plot events selling fresh produce to our fellow residents and much, much more.

COVID may have slowed us down, but it hasn't dampened our spirits!

First Open Plot Event of the year hosted by TGV In Bloom



The start of the month marked a great milestone for TGV In Bloom, which held its first Open Plot Event of the year in line with Covid safety guidelines.

Around 500 people attended the three-hour open-air event around the allotments, raising funds for the village and local good causes.

Nearly £700 was collected from donations kindly exchanged for fresh produce grown by the TGV In Bloom volunteers at the community allotment. All proceeds will be put to a good use in and around the Village as well as helping to fund the group's major project for this year, the completion of the Thankful Village Memorial Site at the end of The Stray.

We were delighted to co-host the event with 13 local businesses who had a stall at their Open Plot, and everyone enjoyed seeing and sampling, their wares.
